

HALTER HORSES

- The **Grand Champion** will receive one (1) more point than the Reserve Champion.
- The **Reserve Champion** will receive one (1) more point than any other horses one year of age or older in its sex division.

YEAR END HIGH POINT AWARDS

- **High Point Open Horse:** There will be a high point and reserve high point open horse award that includes all open events, including halter. Points are to be accumulated in a minimum of three different OPEN *classes*.
- **High Point Amateur:** There will be a high point and reserve high point amateur award. Points are to be accumulated in a minimum of three different AMATEUR ALL AGES *classes*.
- **High Point Select Amateur:** There will be a high point and reserve high point select amateur award. Points are to be accumulated in a minimum of three different SELECT AMATEUR *classes*. *Please note - points accumulated in Amateur classes will not count towards the Select Amateur High Point awards.*
- **High Point Novice Amateur:** There will be a high point and reserve high point novice amateur award. Points are to be accumulated in a minimum of three different NOVICE AMATEUR *classes*.
- **High Point Youth 13 & Under:** There will be a high point and reserve high point youth 13 & under award. The recipients must be 13 years of age or under, as of January 1st, of the current show season. Points are to be accumulated in a minimum of three different YOUTH *classes*.
- **High Point Youth 14 to 18:** There will be a high point and reserve high point youth 14 to 18 awards. The recipients must be between 14 and 18 years of age as of January 1st, of the current show season. Points will be accumulated in a minimum of three different YOUTH *classes*.
- **High Point Novice Youth:** There will be a high point and reserve high point youth award. Points are to be accumulated in a minimum of three different NOVICE YOUTH *classes*.

Other Notes:

- **Area 3 Point Approved shows 2006:**
 - Spring Classic (Barrie)- May 19-22
 - Teen Ranch (Orangeville) - June 24 - 25
 - Summerama (Palgrave)- July 1 - 4
 - Area 3 Futurity (Location TBD)- August 11 (note – only selected classes will count towards year end points)
 - Summer Circuit (Location TBD)- August 12 - 13
- **NON PRO Rule:** The following is the rule regarding Non Pro Eligibility:

To be eligible to compete as a Non-Pro, a contestant of any age may compete as long as he or she has not shown, judged, trained or assisted in training a horse (whether or not a registered American Quarter Horse) for remuneration, monetary or otherwise, either directly or indirectly, nor received remuneration for instructing another person in riding, driving, training or showing a horse for five calendar years prior to exhibiting in a Non-Pro class. He or she must not exhibit in open classes horses owned by any third party, but shall only exhibit horses solely owned by the non pro entrant and non pro entrants family (see AQHA rule 403 (5) of the AQHA Handbook). Upon revocation of non-pro status because of ineligibility, all earned non-pro awards and monies from time of violation of eligibility rules shall be revoked. **It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure they meet the non-pro criteria.**
